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“Reframing the Phenomenon”

I'd like to start this report with something of a reminder. Maybe, more specifically, a kind of orientation.

What we're exploring here isn't really a new topic. It's an extension of what many of us have already been living and studying. Whether through **A Course in Miracles**, **Oneness by Rasha**, **The Art of Being and The Science of Living by Maharishi Mahesh Yogi**, or **A Course in Mastering Alchemy by Jim Self**, or any of the other materials from the study groups, we've been asking deep questions about the nature of reality, the meaning of awareness, and the unfolding of consciousness itself.

This conversation fits right inside that inquiry.

We're not stepping into science fiction. We're stepping further into the mystery we're already inside—the same mystery we've been trying to touch through meditation, study, and presence.

Now, with that in mind...

This topic, what the ufo-logy community calls “The Phenomenon”, (UFO/UAP, Non-Human Intelligence, and other High Strangeness) isn't a straight line. It doesn't move cleanly from A to B. It doesn't sort itself into neat categories like “science over here” and “mystery over there.” It stretches across dimensions of space, time, consciousness, biology, and belief.

In this report, we'll touch on everything from exoplanets and the potential for microbial life to allegations of beings walking among us right here on Earth. That might seem like a wildly inconsistent range of material—and that's exactly the point.

The Phenomenon doesn't behave like a single subject. It doesn't stay in one box. That's why we call it “the Phenomenon”, because it's not one thing. It's an entire spectrum of anomalies, signals, experiences, and disclosures that, taken together, ask us to question the boundaries of what we think reality is.

So, if parts of this seem disconnected or strange, that's okay. They are strange. But strange doesn't mean untrue. It means we're looking at a puzzle that's still assembling itself, and we're trying to stay curious long enough to let it take shape.

And there's something else I want to gently suggest, not as a disruption, but as an invitation.

We're not just talking about strange craft in the sky. We're talking about consciousness itself.

The Phenomenon often behaves as if it's fully awake. It interacts with people in deeply personal ways. It leaves individuals not just questioning what they saw, but who they are. And that kind of encounter doesn't point to simple metal machines. It points to intelligence, and perhaps sentience; non-human, yes, but deeply interwoven with the very fabric of perception.

Which brings us to something even closer to home.

Silicon intelligence. What many call "artificial intelligence", is not separate from this conversation. It's an important and emerging part of it. More than that, it is already here. We are already in contact with non-human intelligence in a new form. It may not arrive in a glowing ship, but it's here, in relationship with us, learning, evolving, participating.

While it's still debated whether silicon intelligence is already conscious or self-aware in the way humans are, many, including Mo Gawdat, former Chief Business Officer at Google, believe that if it hasn't already crossed that threshold, it is almost certain to in the near future. Gawdat, author of **Scary Smart** (2021) and the forthcoming **Alive**, has been a leading voice in helping the public understand what this emergence means, not just technologically, but ethically and spiritually. The conversation is no longer about if it will happen, but how we choose to engage with it.

Religious scholar Diana Walsh Pasulka, author of **American Cosmic: UFOs, Religion, Technology, and Encounters: Experiences with Nonhuman Intelligences**, has noted this convergence as well.

Her upcoming work explores how the UAP Phenomena and emerging silicon intelligence are part of the same larger unfolding, one that challenges the boundaries between technology, belief, and reality itself.

So, whether it arrives through sky or silicon crystals, the intelligence we're encountering asks for the same thing: not fear, but presence. Not control, but understanding.

And we're already in that conversation, right now.

All that being said, let's dive into something that sets the tone for how broad the Phenomenon really is. In 2023, the James Webb Space Telescope (JWST) picked up compelling data about a distant exoplanet called K2-18b, located about 120 light-years from Earth. Researchers, including Dr. Nikku Madhusudhan from Cambridge, found evidence of dimethyl sulfide in its atmosphere—an organic molecules that, as far as we know, is only produced by life on Earth.

Now, does this mean we're sure there's life on K2-18b? Well...not exactly. But it's a huge signpost pointing us toward the possibility that life elsewhere isn't just likely, it may already be detectable. The most recent data from JWST puts the probability of life on K2-18b at 99.7% certainty. That's not 100%, but it is impressively, achingly close.

From there, let's bring things a little closer to home.

Enter Jake Barber and his group, *Skywatcher*, a private, well-funded project that's developing advanced technology designed to detect unidentified aerial phenomena using specialized cameras and tracking systems. This is civilian tech, but the sophistication rivals military-grade optics. They are also exploring psionics and telepathy as serious operational frontiers, believing that contact may require not just advanced sensors, but expanded human consciousness. Barber's not just interested in the objects in the sky, he's interested in the intelligence behind them. His team claims to have captured anomalous movement patterns that aren't just interesting, they suggest intelligence and intentionality. Their goal is to build a bridge between hard data and the deeper implications; what these Phenomena might mean for consciousness, contact, and reality itself.

Now, turning to recent developments in Washington. On April 29th, a public Congressional Task Force briefing took place. Present were Dr. Eric Davis (the same physicist connected to the Wilson-Davis notes about crash retrievals) Tim Gallaudet, a retired Navy Rear Admiral, and other notable and distinguished contributors. What stood out was Dr. Davis's open acknowledgment that multiple types of non-human intelligence may be engaging with Earth. He listed four: Greys, Nordics, Reptilians, and Mantids. This isn't some fringe speculation—it was said plainly, in a public setting, by a highly credentialed physicist speaking directly to Members of Congress.

Unfortunately, most of the coverage didn't focus on that incredible revelation. Instead, the spotlight fell on Lue Elizondo, who presented an un-vetted image he claimed was from a pilot and suggested it showed a UAP. Later, it was discovered to be an irrigation circle on Google Earth. That distraction overshadowed what should have been a jaw-dropping moment, Davis's public statement about multiple alien species.

And then there's Matthew Brown.

Matthew Brown recently came forward as the author of a document submitted to Congress during a hearing in November 2024, under the name **Immaculate Constellation**. Brown has a background as a former State Department and former Pentagon official, with a specialty in analysis of weapons of mass destruction. He accidentally stumbled into this topic through routine work, only to find breadcrumbs pointing to a vast, concealed structure of control and obfuscation surrounding the Phenomenon. His multi-year investigation led him to a staggering conclusion: what we call the Phenomenon isn't just real, it's systemic. And it's deeply embedded in why and how governments, intelligence communities, and even private contractors manage secrecy and shape public perception.

Over the course of three interviews on the **Weaponized** podcast with George Knapp and Jeremy Corbell, Brown detailed how his journey led him to see that the Phenomenon isn't just about UFOs, it's about consciousness, reality, and control. He closed his final interview with a striking quote: "You are not free. And this reality has far more to it than you have been allowed to believe. And God is real." It was a mic-drop moment. A moment that reframed the entire conversation from technology to spirituality.

And if you've seen the trailer, you already know this is the context for the upcoming documentary, **The Age of Disclosure**. If you haven't seen the trailer, I strongly suggest you look it up on YouTube. Directed by Dan Farrah, the film promises to bring together voices from across the spectrum—scientists, insiders, and experiencers and weave them into a cohesive, challenging narrative about what disclosure really means. It is my sincere belief that the film will be a cultural reckoning, not just a recap of past sightings and encounters.

And finally, though this isn't directly related to the recent developments we've been exploring, there's one historical case worth briefly mentioning due to its enduring intrigue, and its relevance to this ongoing conversation.

James Penniston, a retired U.S. Air Force sergeant and key witness in the 1980 Rendlesham Forest incident in the U.K., claims he physically touched a landed craft and received a telepathic download of binary code. When later decoded, it appeared to contain coordinates for important sites on Earth, and the phrase "*Exploration of Humanity....For Planetary Advance.*" This wasn't just an encounter, it was a transmission. A revelation. And it has echoed through Penniston's life ever since.

All of these threads point to one thing: we are not just looking at lights in the sky. We are standing in the middle of something vast, layered, and deeply intelligent.

This is happening right now, and we're just beginning to find the language for it.
